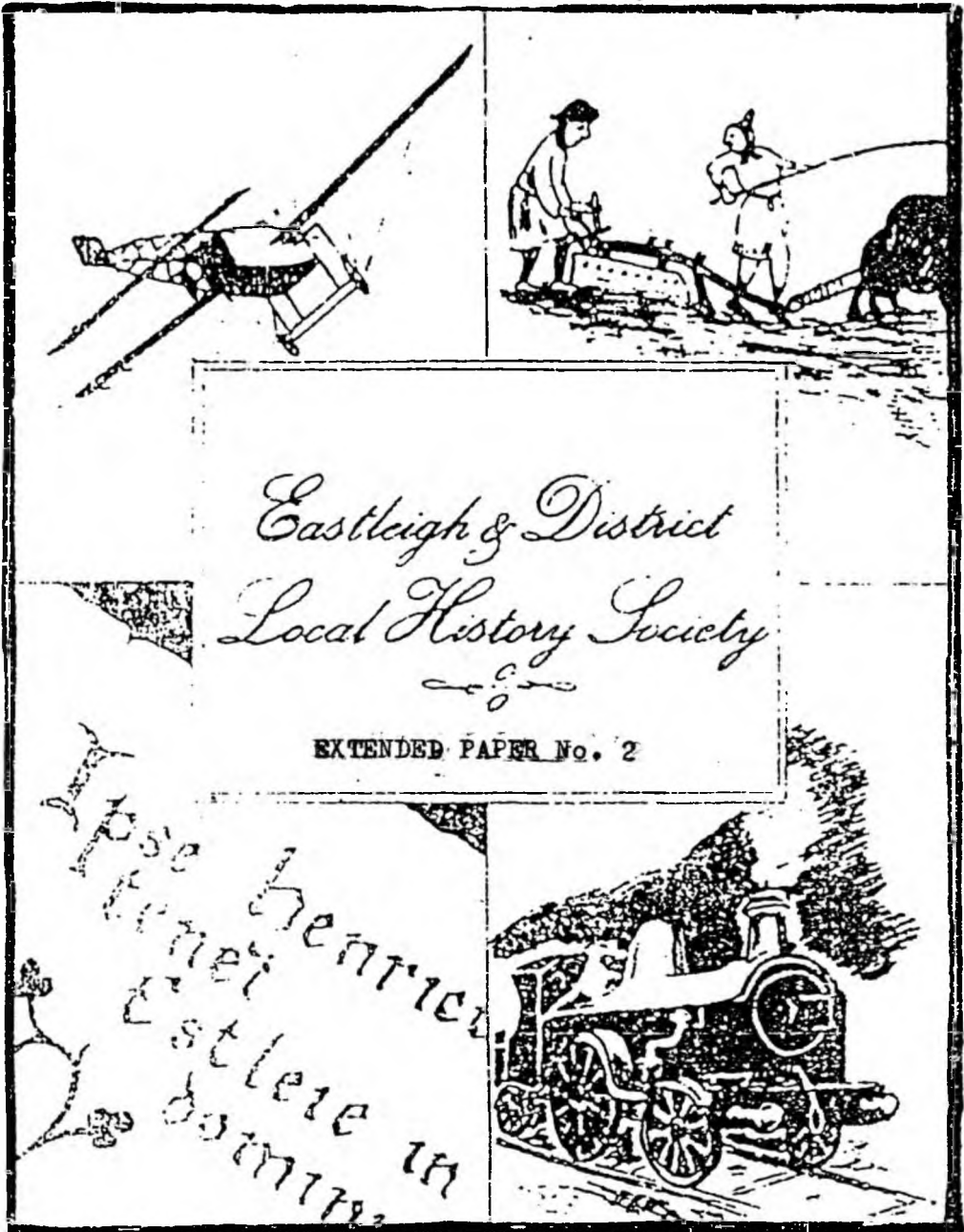

P R E F A C E

There was no standing army in England before the latter half of the seventeenth-century. Earlier rulers had relied on a variety of methods to raise manpower for either defensive or offensive purposes as and when the occasion arose.

William I distributed some of his newly acquired lands through his Tenants-in-Chiefs' to various people in return for Homage and a Knight's Fee. The former involved swearing an oath of fealty and obedience to the King; the latter an obligation to provide an armed knight, together with his servants, for forty days a year.

In 1181 Henry II issued an Assize of Arms which, amongst other things, provided that juries from towns and hundreds should make assessments of obligations for military service.

During the Tudor period, the Lieutenancy was introduced. Henry VIII had appointed deputies, or lieutenants, in most of the shires, (The majority of these were noblemen, thus leading to the present day office of Lord Lieutenant of the County). One of their more important duties was to ascertain the military capabilities of their area and to ensure sufficient training was given to enable an adequate response could be made to meet any emergency. Subdivisions were formed and, since social position determined military rank, someone of substance was placed in charge of each. They in their turn appointed a person of local prestige, usually a prominent landowner with the standing of gentleman to organise his own particular area.

In peace time, general musters were held every three years although in the meantime it was the responsibility of unit commanders to ensure their men were practiced at intervals and all weapons kept in good repair. All fit men between 16 and 60 were liable for service though not all, for reasons of expense, were called. Those of any substance unable to serve were required to 'furnish'

the equipment needed.

In the event the Militia was never called upon to participate in actual fighting although it was mobilised three times, in 1588, 1596 and 1599 against the possible threat of a Spanish invasion.

For a full and academic discussion of the subject readers are advised to consult BOYNTON, Lindsay " The Elizabethan Militia 1558-1638" (London, 1967)

The much under-used collection of muster rolls in the custodianship of the Hampshire Record Office (44M69 / ...) form an invaluable source both for the local historian and, because they frequently pre-date surviving parish registers, to the genealogist. It is hoped that this very small section of the material will encourage researchers to investigate their own particular area.

The compilers wish to place on record the help and advice given by members of the Record Office staff and also to the owner of the Herriard Collection, Mr. Jervoise, for permission both to examine the material and to reproduce the following pages.

For ease of reference the material has been collated under centres of population headings and does not always follow the strict order of the actual muster rolls.
